





Teen Drama Camp

Do you have fun pretending? Have you imagined yourself performing?

Starting in January, teens in the King George neighbourhood will be invited to attend a weekly

drama camp for 1 1/2 hours at King George school. They will learn some basics about being a character onstage, and will learn how to create dramatic scenes based on issues that directly affect them, i.e. bullying, friendships, drugs. The final session in March will have an invited audience which will participate in offering ideas to solve the issues you present through drama.

The camp will be facilitated by an experienced theatre instructor and director, and it is **FREE** for teens 14-18 years of age.

The teen drama camp will be a safe and encouraging space for young people to try new things. Up to 15 participants will be accepted, but commitment in attending will be important.

The Rink is **FREE** to use. Each week, specific times are scheduled for skating use only (no hockey sticks or pucks):


Tue 6-8 pm / Sat 11 am-1 pm / Sun 2-4 pm


Are you dreaming of what you'd like to plant in your **King George & Riversdale Community Garden** plot this summer? We are too!




